AKC Code Of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- **Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.**
- **Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.**
- **Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.**
- **The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.**
- **The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.**
- **The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.**
- **The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.**
- **The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.**
- **Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.**
- **Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.**
- **Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.**
- **Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.**
- **Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.**
- **Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.**
- **Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport**

HOTEL RULES & RATES

- Standard King or Double \$110.00; Double or King Fireplace rooms \$147.00; Upgraded room may be requested at the time of reservation but subject to availability.
- Room rates apply to single or double occupancy. Additional persons (18 years and older) will be charged \$15.00 per person, per night.
- Room rates subject to applicable taxes and fees, currently 16%.
- Check-in time is 4:00PM. Checkout time before 11:00AM. The Sawmill asks that you honor the 11:00AM checkout time the day of departure or a half-day rate will be assessed to the individual folio. After 6:00 PM a full day's revenue will be charged.
- Individual reservations/nights must be cancelled 72 hours prior to avoid penalty. Early checkouts will be charged.

NOTE: Individual reservations at the group rate will be honored by the hotel until March 29, 2017. The hotel will accept reservations at the negotiated rate after March 29, 2017 BASED ON ROOM AVAILABILITY.

- Guest Services can arrange to check baggage for those guests arriving early and for guests attending functions on the day of their departure.
- Guest Rental Items. Based on availability, rollaway beds are \$15 per night, cribs, and refrigerators are \$10 per night and children's cribs are complimentary to our guests.
- One night's deposit is required to confirm a room reservation. The room deposit is refundable until 72 hours prior to arrival.
- A \$100 refundable Dog Deposit per room will be required at check in, in case of damage or the need for deep cleaning. The deposit will not be refunded until 72 hours after check out. If the deposit was in cash a check will be issued within 10 days otherwise cards will be credited.
- A non-refundable room inspection is \$40.00 This inspection will not be available at the time of check out. If damage is found from the inspection, the guest will be charged for that damage or cleaning. Please confirm that the address we have on file is correct.
- Four (4) dogs MAXIMUM per room and all dogs must be crated (protection of housekeeping staff) at all times when left unattended in guestrooms. NO exceptions. Rooms without crates will be subject to penalty fees. Plastic is required under all crates in room. Please keep dogs off beds and sofas.
- Dogs must not be bathed or groomed in the sleeping rooms. This will lead to severe clogging of drains, as well as housekeeping problems. The use of hotel linens for bathing dogs is not permitted. As a guest, you will be responsible for any damages that occur in your room.

HOTEL RULES & RATES (con't)

- A central bathing area will be provided
- The grooming room will be locked overnight from 11:00PM to 6:00AM. There will be extra security on duty for the grooming room per the request of the CWCCA. Guests who leave dogs in the grooming room overnight will be doing so at their own risk. All dogs must prominently display an information card with contact information for you in the event that your dog needs your attention. The Lodge of Sawmill Creek Resort and management will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog or property of any exhibitor, whether the result of accident or any other cause. It is expressly understood that every dog is in the care and custody of his owner or handler during the time the dog is on the show premises.
- Every dog owner/agent is expected by the hotel AND CWCCA to pick up after their dogs. Please use the designated exercise areas only. Exercising will not be allowed near the main entrance, near the pool, volleyball courts, or golf course.
- Parking of vehicles in non designated parking spots will not be allowed. Anyone parking on the grass, golf course or along the road will be ticketed.
- Dogs are not permitted in the lobby, restaurant, swimming pool area, gift shop, or meeting rooms unless previously designated as a dog show area.
- The housekeeping department must clean rooms daily (HOTEL POLICY). All rooms must be available for cleaning and all privacy signs must be removed not later than 2:00PM each day. Exceptions will not be made. Anyone refusing service will be subject to penalty fees.
- Please make every effort to keep your dog quiet while in the room.
- Refunds to other guests made by the hotel due to disturbances, including noise, will be charged to the offender.
- Dogs must be leashed at all times when taken to and from the guestrooms.
- All rooms registered under the group block will have bedspreads removed and will be given an additional sheet. Please contact the front desk if you are dogless and wish to have a bedspread.
- RV parking will be in an area designated by the hotel. RV parking at the specialty host hotel is by prior reservation only.
- RV's are expected to keep their parking area neat and clean at all times.

HOTEL RULES & RATES (con't)

- **Each dog owner owner/agent/ RVer/guest is expected to cooperate with the Hotel and/or Specialty Investigative Committee. Dog owners/agents/room registrants will be financially responsible for damage to hotel rooms caused by their dog(s) or themselves. This includes, but not limited to replacement cost for carpeting if odors or stains cannot be removed by traditional cleaning methods. Dog owners/ agents/ room registrants/RVers are expected to settle damage claims on the spot, or else must be willing to furnish information, such as insurance policy numbers & other pertinent information as required/requested.**
- **Any guest found not to be following the above rules may be asked to leave the hotel without a refund. Should a hotel/ motel, for cause, deem it necessary to cancel room privileges, the registrant agrees to forego legal actions against the CWCCA & the hotel/motel.**
- **Exhibitors understand and agree that violations may be referred to the Event Committee if written charges are preferred. If such charges are upheld by the Event Committee, it may lead to suspension from future show privileges. The Specialty Investigative Committee, working in a fair and impartial manner, is charged with investigating complaints and will work closely with the Sawmill Creek Resort and Convention Center Hotel Staff and Event Committee to enforce the above rules. Prompt and decisive action will be taken in the case of rule violations. Depending on the severity of misconduct, disciplinary actions may include charges against CWCCA members filed with the CWCCA Board of Directors or charges under American Kennel Club rules, which would be handled by the Event Committee acting as a Trial Board under the authority of the AKC. The Sawmill Creek Resort and Convention Center and Event Committee reserve the privilege of enacting additional rules as situations require.**

PLEASE BE RESPONSIBLE !



When you or your agent sign the entry form, you automatically agree to the following terms concerning your stay in any hotel or motel during the duration of our Specialty. Exhibitors with recreational vehicles should follow the rules as applicable. These rules have been established for the good of all exhibitors and to help maintain good relationships between the dog show community and hotels/motels.

1. Plastic sheeting must be placed under every crate in a hotel/motel room. This will keep carpets clean and dry. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to provide their own plastic sheeting.
2. Dogs must be crated when owner is out of the room. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
3. Dogs must be kept on leash at all times while in the hotel/motel, lobbies or on the hotel/motel grounds with the exception of dogs in exercise pens or performance dogs practicing, warming up or trialing.
4. Under no circumstances can adhesive tape, tacks or any kind of sticky adhesives be used on the guest room doors.
5. No grooming or bathing of dogs in any guestroom. Bathing may only be done in the designated bathing area. Exhibitors must supply own shampoo and towels. Hotel/motel towels may not be used for bathing dogs.
6. The hotel/motel management may choose to remove all bedspreads from guestrooms occupied with dogs. Guests should provide sheets or covers for all beds and sofas or chairs in their rooms to avoid significant dog hair accumulation on the furniture.
7. Hotel/motel guests are requested to voluntarily report damages when and if they occur. Rooms will be inspected daily by members of the hotel/motel staff & observed violations or damages will be reported to the hotel/motel management and/or the Specialty Investigative Committee.
8. Dogs should only be "exercised" in designated areas on motel premises. Every dog owner is expected to pick up after their own dog(s) & dispose of waste in designated trash cans. Failure to do so should be reported to the Specialty Investigative Committee. Observe "no dogs" posted areas. It is the responsibility of the dog owner/agent to find out from the hotel's staff where these areas and cans are located if not clearly marked. Do not allow your dog to urinate or defecate on the hotel/motel buildings, or on the landscaped areas of the hotel.
9. Due to health regulations and the presence of non-dog owning guests at the host hotel, dogs are not allowed near food service areas or any area posted as prohibited. No dogs are allowed in the restaurant, lounge, pool or pool area, fitness center, meeting rooms (without club approval) or public restrooms.
10. Do not let your dog become a nuisance to your neighbor. There will be non-dog guests at the hotel. Excessive barking will be reported to the Specialty Investigative Committee and repeat violators may be asked to leave.
11. RV parking will be in an area designated by the hotel. RV parking at the specialty host hotel/motel is by prior reservation only. The specialty host hotel/motel will provide each RV staying on site with a Parking Permit.
12. RV's are expected to keep their parking area neat and clean at all times.
13. Each dog owner/agent/RVer/guest is expected to cooperate with the hotel/motel and/or Specialty Investigative Committee.
14. Dog owners/agents/room registrants will be financially responsible for damage to hotel/motel rooms caused by their dog(s) or themselves. This includes, but not limited to replacement cost for carpeting if odors or stains cannot be removed by traditional cleaning methods.
15. Dog owners/ agents/ room registrants/RVer's are expected to settle damage claims on the spot, or else must be willing to furnish information, such as insurance policy numbers & other pertinent information as required/requested.
16. Any guest found not to be following the above rules may be asked to leave the hotel/motel without a refund. Should a hotel/ motel, for cause, deem it necessary to cancel room privileges, the registrant agrees to forego legal actions against the CWCCA & the hotel/motel.
17. Exhibitors understand and agree that violations may be referred to the Event Committee if written charges are preferred. If such charges are upheld by the Event Committee, it may lead to suspension from future show privileges.
18. Hotels/motels have the right to charge a deposit (refundable or nonrefundable). The Specialty Investigative Committee, working in a fair and impartial manner, is charged with investigating complaints and will work closely with the Host hotel/motel Staff and Event Committee to enforce the above rules. Prompt and decisive action will be taken in the case of rule violations. Depending on the severity of misconduct, disciplinary actions may include charges against CWCCA members filed with the CWCCA Board of Directors or charges under American Kennel Club rules, which would be handled by the Event Committee acting as a Trial Board under the authority of the AKC.

Formal Attire Tails by Cardigans

At the 24th Annual Megan Competition formal attire is requested. The gala event will be held Wednesday, May 3rd at the Sawmill Creek Resort and Event Center in Huron, Ohio.

Our thanks to Megan Chair, **Jacque Glenn** for making this year's Competition one to remember!!!!

Judges for the 2017 Megan are Don Glenn, Cindy Bossi, Nancy Babyak

The Megan is considered a **formal attire event. Please help us celebrate the 75th anniversary of our club by wearing formal attire!**

The Cardigan Welsh Corgi Club of America, Inc dedicates the Megan Competition to the memory of Roberta Holden Bole, who brought the first Cardigans to this country in 1931. She was the guiding force behind the formation of the Cardigan Welsh Corgi Club of America in 1935. She organized many of the early Cardigan supported shows and Specialties. In all, Mrs. Bole imported more than 20 Cardigans. Some died in transit. Others she was never able to register. Nevertheless, through her continuing efforts, she was able to launch the breed in this country for all of us to enjoy.

Advancing from the Preliminary or Intermediate Rounds is often referred to *'making the cut'*, and carries a great deal of prestige in being recognized among the pinnacles of Cardigan breed development. In that light, the Megan is traditionally considered a formal attire event. This competition is open to all Cardigan Welsh Corgis world wide that have completed the requirements for a conformation championship. AKC approval of this event is not required as this competition is considered a Fun Match, therefore non-pointed.

The AKC does require that entries in this competition be restricted to dogs owned or co-owned by members of the CWCCA. Spayed or neutered champions, regardless of age, are eligible for this competition. The CWCCA requires that persons living in the same household, co-owning or co-breeding with any of the Megan judging panel cannot exhibit in that years Megan.

Through the generosity of the members and friends of the CWCCA, this competition offers the following awards:

- **Best & Runner-Up** in each of the eight classes divided by sex & color receive a rosette.
- **Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi** – the Megan Award & Megan Medallion
- **Breeder of the Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi** – the Hanging Rock Award & Megan Medallion. This is automatically awarded to the breeder of the dog winning the Megan Competition
- **Runner-Up to Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi** – the Cadno Award & Megan Medallion
- **Best of Opposite Sex to Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi** – the Cassie Award & Megan Medallion

The Megan Medallion bears a likeness of the first American Champion Cardigan, MEGAN.

Three judges and two alternates for this competition are selected by the CWCCA membership and may only judge the Megan once in a (5) year period and must have a minimum of ten (10) years experience in the breed.

Below is a synopsis of the competition procedures. The official rules are published in the Premium List.

There are eight (8) classes divided by sex and color in the Preliminary and Intermediate Rounds of competition.

The Final Round is a single class consisting of the Bests from the Intermediate Round.

The color divisions are Red/Sable, Brindle, Black and Blue Merle.

Preliminary Round: Each of two judges will examine each entry individually on the table and then both judges will stand together while each entry is moved. When preliminary judging of the entire class is completed, each judge submits at least one but not more than four (1-4) entries that they wish to pass on to the Intermediate Round of competition. This selection process will result in a minimum of one (1) and a maximum of eight (8) entries advancing to the Intermediate Round from a class.

Intermediate Round: Judging is similar to the Preliminary Round except the Judges are rotated. Best and Runner-Up in each class are selected with the Best moving on to the Final Round of competition.

Final Round: The eight (8) class winners are judged together in the ring for the title Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi.

When the Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi is selected, the Runner-Up from the class of the Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi from the Intermediate Round enters the ring to compete for Runner-Up to Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi and/or Best Opposite Sex to the Best Cardigan Welsh Corgi.



BEST OF BREED JUDGING

Best of Breed judging as requested by 2017 National Specialty judge

This class will be split by sex into groups of 10. Dog groups will be judged first, followed by bitches. There will NOT be a mass check-in at the start of BOB judging. You will only be counted absent if you do not check in for your assigned group.

The Chief Ring Steward will break down the groups, in catalog order, and post them Wednesday evening. If you have more than one dog in a group please advise the ring steward by 4 PM Thursday so you can be assigned separate groups.

The last group of each sex will include first place veterans and herding titled plus any move-ups. Winner's dog and winner's bitch will come in at the end with the final cuts.

Last minute changes may be made to accommodate veteran or herding class winners or WD/WB.

In the event that individual should make the cut with more than one exhibit, it is their responsibility to have alternate handlers available for their entries as would occur under normal judging procedures.

Herding Titled Dog & Herding Titled Bitch Classes

- **Any Cardigan Welsh Corgi over 6 months of age that has acquired an AKC Herding title of record will be eligible for this class.**
- **The winner of these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed. A dog that has been neutered or spayed is NOT eligible to be exhibited in this Class.**
- **If entered in this class and BOB they may NOT be exhibited in BOB if they are defeated in the Herding Titled non-regular class.**
- **Instinct tests are a certificate, NOT a title and therefore do not qualify a dog for the class.**

4-6 month Puppy Class

Intended to introduce new exhibitors/puppies to the dog-show world in a stress-free & relaxed environment and an opportunity for puppies to socialize with people & other dogs at an optimal time of their development.

We will enjoy this class on Friday morning and hope that all new babies come out to show their stuff.

ABOUT JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

The first dog handling competition for youth at a formal dog show was held in 1932 at the Westbury Kennel Club Show in Long Island, New York, in the United States. In 1933 the Westminster Kennel Club in New York offered a children's handling class, and prizes were established in the names of early promoters of children's events, Leonard Brumby, Sr, and George F. Foley. The American Kennel Club recognized Junior Showmanship as a dog show class in 1971.

Junior Showmanship offers youth between the ages of 9 and 18 years of age an opportunity to develop their handling skills, learn about good sportsmanship and learn about dogs and dog shows.

Juniors are judged on their ability to present, or handle, their dogs as they would in the breed ring.

Eligibility of Dog - Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather, or grandmother, including the corresponding step and half relations, or by a member of the Junior Handler's household

AKC Junior Showmanship Classes/Age Grouping:

Novice: For youth who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open: For youth who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class in a licensed or member show, with competition present in the Novice class. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

Master For youth who are at least nine (9) years old and under eighteen (18) years on the day of the show, and who have won the ten (10) first place wins in an Open Class with Competition to be eligible to enter the Limited Class Competition. The calendar for this class will be November 1 thru October 31 of the following year. All juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed, all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

Each of the above regular classes are further divided by age on the day of the show into...

Junior - 9 yrs & under 12 yrs, **Intermediate** - 12 yrs & under 15 yrs and **Senior** - 15 yrs & under 18 yrs.

In the catalog, you will see the above classes & age groups combined, such as Novice Junior, Open Senior, etc.

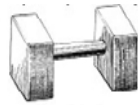

Breed Education - A VERY Special Presentation

Thursday, May 4th 8 AM

Dr. Jerold S Bell DVM, from the Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine at Tufts University, will present a seminar in two parts.

Part 1 - The Ins and Outs of Pedigree Analysis, Genetic Diversity, and Genetic Disease Control. Based on his analysis of a Cardigan Welsh Corgi pedigree database, AKC registration statistics, and pedigree analysis of our most influential dogs and bitches, Dr. Bell will discuss genetic diversity in the breed, how the selection of mates and types of matings manipulates the genes of the ancestors in the pedigree, and popular sire syndrome.

A question and answer period will close this part, with a 10-15 minute break.

Part 2 - The genetic disorders affecting the Cardigan Welsh Corgi. Dr. Bell will provide updates on any pertinent research and analyze our current health survey in relation to what is seen in the field. He will cover the different types of genetic tests, their availability, and their proper use. It will include breeding recommendations to manage different types of genetic disorders.

A question and answer period will follow.

DNA TESTING

DNA Test Kits: The following DNA test kits and assistance in collecting samples will be available:

- PRA
- SOD1/DM Risk Factor
- Coat Length/fluff
- Merle
- Coat Color (Pink, Black/points, Mask, Dilute, etc.)
- AKC DNA profile for identification (required for frequently used sires and frozen semen)

CHIC DNA Repository

Sign Up: On the Consolidated Order Form. Don and Cecelia will donate the price of the paperwork from the AKC.

Fees: The TDI Test (only) is \$20.00 The fee for two tests together is \$30.00.

If anyone is unsure of his or her dogs ability to pass the tests, please come and meet with Don or Cecelia and they will walk you through what is required. Handicapped dogs and people can pass these tests. As Pat Santi often said, "I feel that this is an important part of giving to the community and helps the community learn that dogs do make a difference in people's lives."

Volunteers are needed to assist Don and Cecelia with the testing, playing a friendly stranger, being part of a crowd, etc. We especially need children who can make the commitment to help one or both days. TDI testing requires the presence of two children. Contact Don & Cecelia to Volunteer and with any questions at 231-633-8461 or Coldstream@charternet.

Per Day Limit: Due to the time limitations, 8 dogs per day for either CGC or TDI will be tested. Testing will be scheduled at 15 minute intervals. As required by TDI, TDI testing must be open to all dogs who apply and must be publicized on the TDI website. Early entry is encouraged.

The Canine Good Citizen Program is a two-part program. First, to teach responsible dog ownership to owners and second, to certify that dogs have the training and behaviors needed to be reliable.

CGC tests are noncompetitive. Dogs are not required to perform items on the test with the same precision needed in formal obedience trials.

There are 10 elements for the dog to pass on the CGC Test:

1. Accepting a Friendly Stranger
2. Sitting Politely for Petting
3. Appearance and Grooming
4. Out for a walk on a loose lead
5. Walking through a Crowd
6. Sit and Down on Command & Staying in Place
7. Coming When Called
8. Reaction to Another Dog
9. Reaction to Distractions
10. Supervised Separation.

Additional requirements for CGCA testing may be found on the AKC website at <http://www.akc.org/dog-owners/training/akc-community-canine>

You no longer need a rabies certificate or immunization record for the CGC tests. You will be asked to sign a pledge that your dog is current on his vaccinations. CGC Testing may be done on a 6 foot lead with a buckle or slip collar or body harness. Head and pinch collars are not allowed. Dogs can be any age to be tested.

Fees for CGC tests are \$15 per test.

Therapy Dogs International (TDI) test is much like the CGCA test with added changes:

The dog must be comfortable around several people and medical equipment. Dogs are tested on buckle collar or non-restrictive body harness. This is a test of behavior, as a dog that jumps on people could hurt a sick person.

TDI is a natural extension of the AKC's CGC test for dogs who are particularly sensitive and attentive to people. TDI will only test dogs over one year old.

For TDI you must have a current rabies certificate and a license for your dog, if required by the state in which you live.

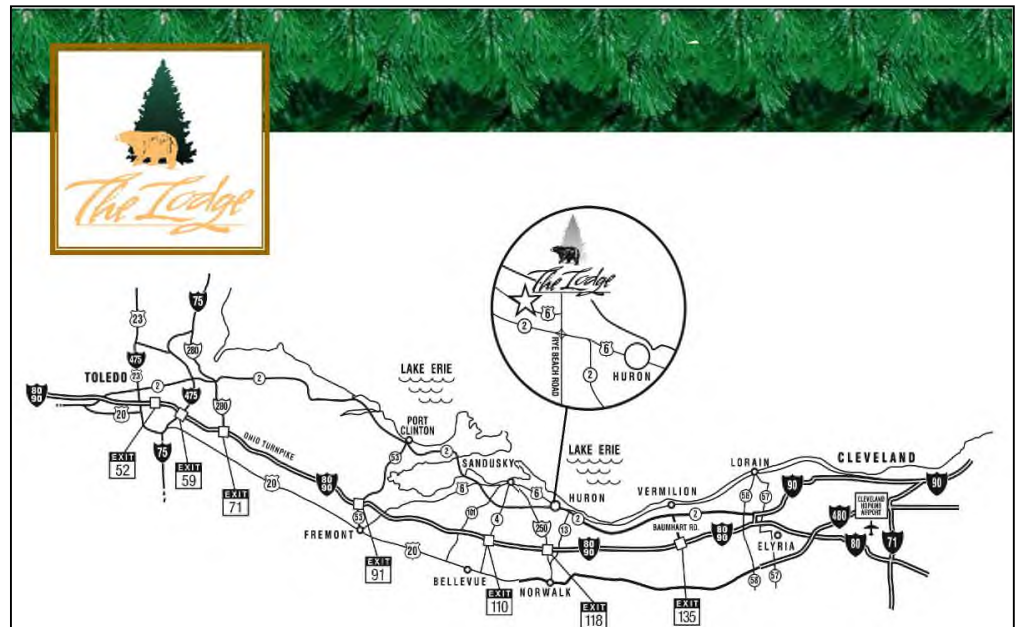

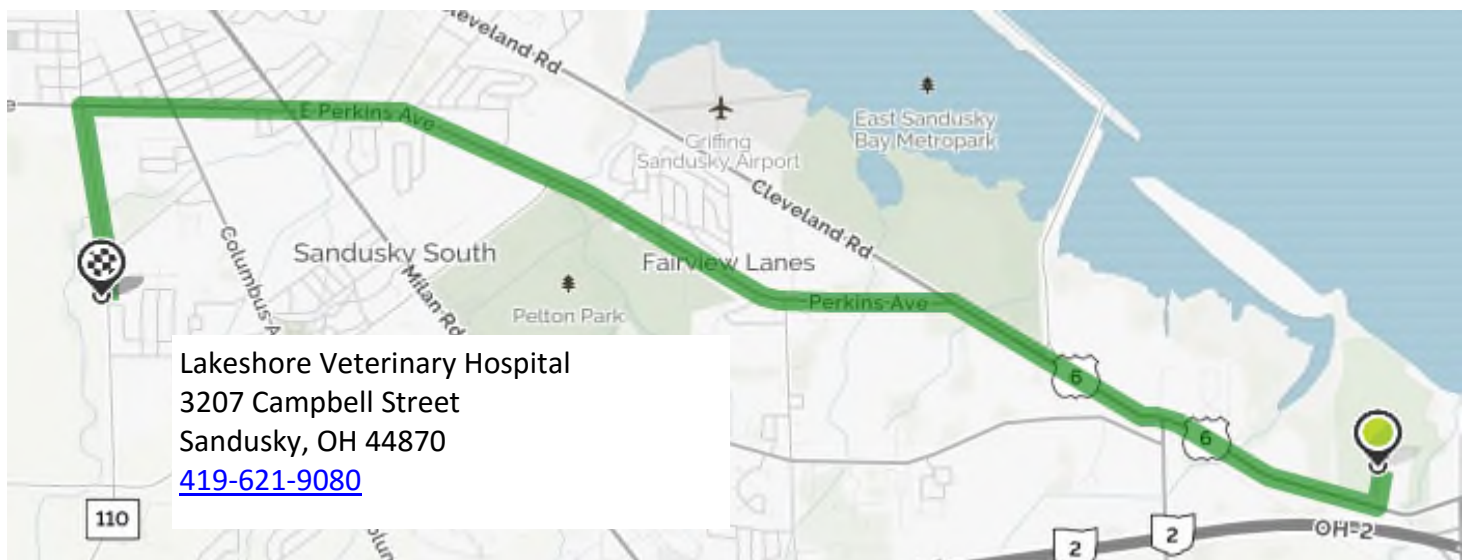
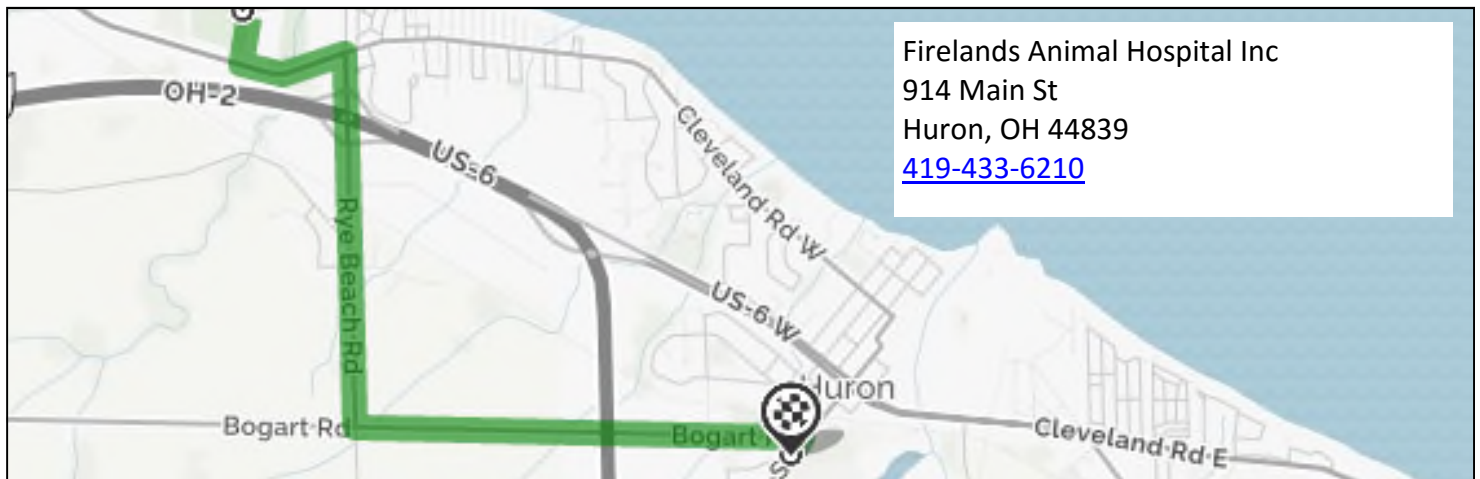
